About the Teacher:

Ajahn Dtun was born in 1955 in the province of Ayutthaya, Thailand. He was raised in Bangkok. After completing his Bachelor's degree in Economics, Ajahn Dtun decided to become a monk at Wat Nong Pah Pong with the Venerable Ajahn Chah as his preceptor. Presently, Ajahn Dtun is the Abbot of Wat Boonyawad in the province of Chonburi where he has lived for the past 19 years. Tan Ajahn Dtun has been a monk for 32 years. While he has led several 10-Day Retreats in Victoria, this is Ajahn Dtun's first teaching engagement in New South Wales.

He will be accompanied by Ajahn Tejapanno, his translator. Ajahn Tejapanno has been a monk for 17 years, and has spent the last 13 years living with Ajahn Dtun.
